Terminology

HiLo: Alternating high and low static tones

Howler: A device installed in some vehicles primarily in USA, which adds a low tone to sirens (also known as a Rumbler)

Piercer: Very fast pitch ramps, almost to a point of being imperceptibly fast

Wail: Slow pitch ramps of multiple seconds
Yelp: Fast pitch ramps of around 300ms to 1s
